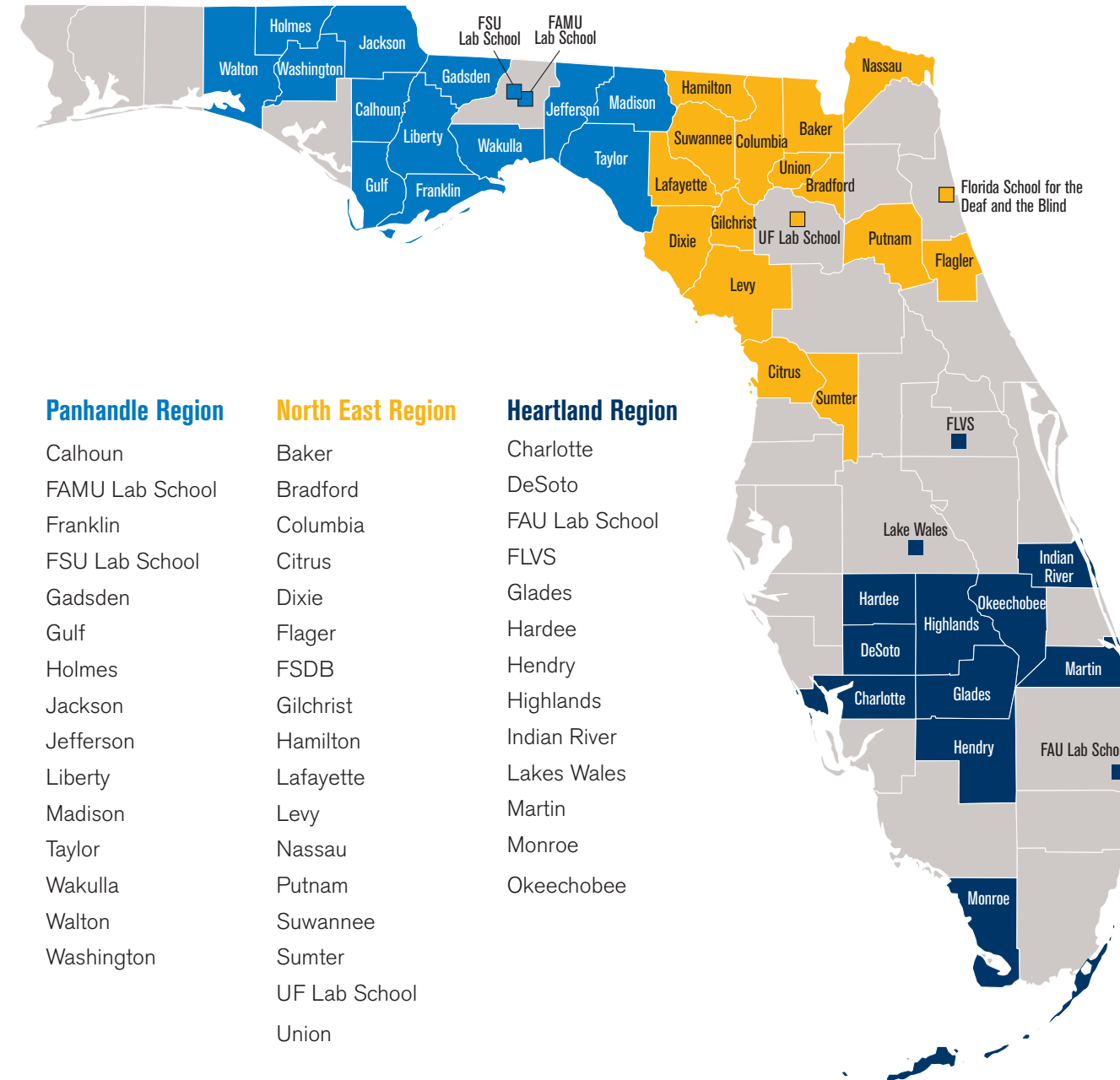
ABOUT ISRD
